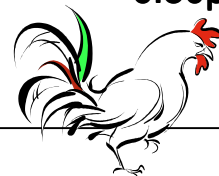

We want to purchase a Thermal Imaging Camera and additional camera equipment to record fire and accident scenes.

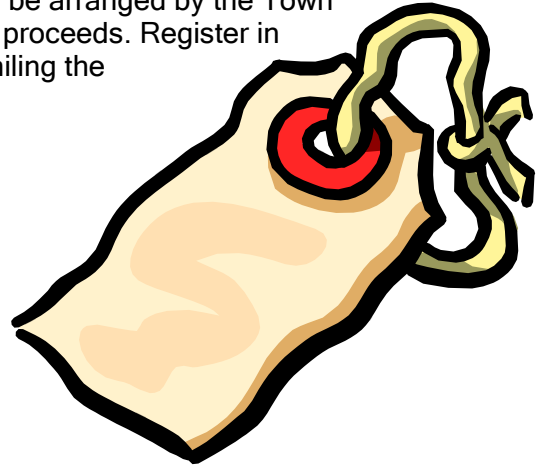
How does this benefit you?

Thermal Imaging Cameras are heat sensitive. It can find an unconscious person or child in a fire and save a life. It can also find a fire hidden within a wall or an electrical fire. Other cameras will record accident and fire scenes. This information can be used by medical personnel to treat patients, insurance companies in their investigation and for training. 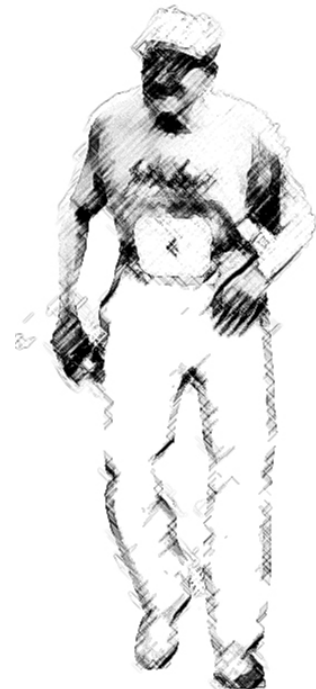

GARDEN ENTHUSIASTS WANTED!

Weeks Brick House and Gardens, New England's oldest native brick house located just off Route 33 and Tide Mill Road in Greenland, is seeking one or more enthusiastic gardening volunteers to restore the colonial gardens to their former glory. Volunteers are needed to water, weed and maintain three small, historic colonial gardens in Greenland throughout the summer and early fall depending upon rainfall and weather conditions.

The gardens, established in 1977, are planted to be consistent with their usage in Colonial times. Three small raised beds hold herbs used for kitchen needs, household medicines and household aids.

At the completion of the season, each volunteer will receive a complimentary copy of the Weeks Brick House garden book, *Gardening with New England Colonial Plants*. A copy of the book will also be provided as a guide for volunteers.
