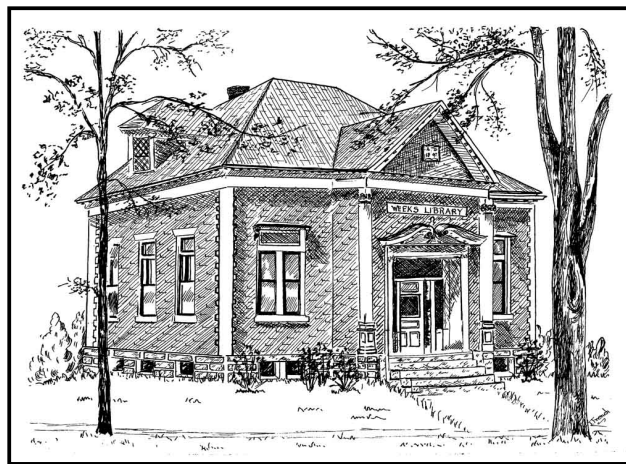

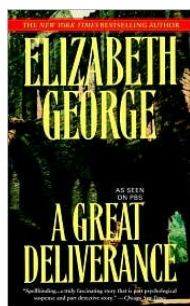

Mehndi (the art of henna painting on the body) has been around for over five thousand years. It used to be found mostly in India, the Middle East and Africa. Originally and still in some places today, it is applied during rites of passage. Henna painting may also take place during joyous celebrations, which is what our Henna Painting will be about.
